Pick a number: 416 or \$416

Hold the phone! Market exists for code that makes businesses appear 'established'

Opportunity's calling, 416ers: those three digits at the beginning of your phone number could make for a lucrative payday.

Toronto's most coveted area code is becoming a business, with 10-digit 416 numbers selling for hundreds even thousands — of dollars. "All my advertisements are in the Yonge and Finch area, and in the North York papers, so 416 targets my clientele," says Reza Esmaeili, a residential and commercial real-estate broker with Homelife/Victory Realty, who purchased his current phone number, 416-888-SOLD, for \$500.

The 416 tells his customers he's established, Esmaeili says.

gers on the other end that if they wanted to sell, he was ready to buy.

The person who once held Esmaeili's current number was happy to make some money, the broker said.

"It was not a real-estate agent, fortunately — it was just a regular person. They were more than happy. They said, 'OK, I sell it for \$500, I get another one for free.'"

Being perceived as established is a common desire among cus-

tomers looking to buy 416 numbers, said Georgios Pappas, a phone-number vendor behind websites like numbers.com.

"They feel that a 647 number makes them feel like they're not established. Let's say you need a lawyer. If you call a 647 number, how credible is that lawyer, how many years has he been in business for?"

Pappas searches for creative 416 numbers through various carriers in the city. Once he is assigned a number, he makes the minimum payments on the account each month until someone buys the number from him. Pappas charges a minimum of \$99 but has previously sold the 10 digits for as much as \$2,000.

Glen Brown, project manager with the Canadian Numbering Association, said the association no longer hands out 416 numbers to Toronto carriers.

However, for the 13-yearold 647 code, there are still 2,010,000 numbers left to be assigned. The 437 code has only been assigned to 260,000 people since its inception in March 2013. **TORSTAR NEWS SERVICE**

19 the deadliest birthday: Study

What do you get when you mix young people with birthdays and a lot of booze? A consistent spike in alcohol-related hospital admissions that occur around the time of birthdays, claims a recent study published by the Society for the Study of Addiction.

Using data from April 2002 to March 2007, researchers determined when Ontarians aged 12 to 30 were most likely to turn up at a hospital for a variety of alcohol-related conditions.

The most deadly birthday for both Óntario men and woman was by far their 19th, according to the study. TORSTAR NEWS SERVICE

Overnight construction: It sounds better in theory

Transportation. Resident complaints are

the reason jackhammers don't go 24-7, says official as Toronto upgrades traffic system to battle congestion

During this summer of lane closures and traffic jams, the man in charge of keeping Toronto moving answers the question fuming motorists want to know: Why don't construction crews work overtime and overnight?

"Everyone says, 'I want 24-7 construction,' " Stephen Buckley, general manager of the city's transportation department, told a news conference Wednesday.

"But wait until the jackhammer (is) outside someone's window, or outside of a hotel, and the phone will start ringing off the hook about, 'What are you guys doing?' So 24-7 is not really an option."

Buckley, joined by Mayor Rob Ford, was unveiling Toronto's "new and improved" transportations operations centre on Don Mills Road. The high-tech hub features a video wall permitting city traffic spotters to monitor traffic that's moving - or not - on expressways and main roads.

One hundred new traffic cameras feed images into the room - and 120 more cameras will be installed over the next two years - allowing the spot-

Overall strategy

The hub is part of an overall congestion management plan unanimously approved by city council last November. The plan includes improving traffic signal co-ordination at 1,000 key intersections.

ters to dispatch emergency responders more quickly to help get traffic flowing again.

Fifty per cent of congestion in the city relates to "nonrecurring events," and staff are exploring new ways to better manage these emergencies and

crashes, he said. "Unfortunately, this isn't going to be something where we flip a switch on one day

and everyone notices things are better. It's ... gradual and incremental improvements,' Buckley said.

Ford said the investment of \$20 million to upgrade traffic management systems is ready starting to pay off."

"We will continue to see vast improvements in traffic flow as it rolls out.... This is real action," Ford said.

Buckley said he was meeting with a contractors association "to look for ways to accelerate construction.'

He also disputed the popular opinion that Toronto has the worst congestion in North America. He suggested the city is behind Los Angeles and New York City and seven or eight

Residents fear for family in Gaza, Israel

Two views on conflict.

Torontonians talk of daily anxiety and hope for peace in Middle East



Toronto-area residents with family in Gaza and Israel, the conflict is a constant worry

"My sister lives in the al-Bureij, near the border," said Hamed Abu Sitta, who lives in Mississauga and has family in Gaza. "I can hear the shellings and the machine guns when I call her — I call her all the time."

"The greatest worry is when the kids, the younger kids, are not at home," said Howard English, who lives in Toronto and has family in Israel. "When they're at home and a siren sounds they can go to what's known as a safe room — the emergency room all Israeli homes are required to build — but when they're walking on the street, it's another story. They have to go to the nearest shelter.'

Abu Sitta and English each spoke with Metro recently about what it's been like to endure the conflict from afar.

Since Israel launched its operation in Gaza on July 8, in response to heavy rocket fire out of Hamas-controlled Gaza, more than 680 Palestinians and 34 Israelis have been killed in the conflict.

Navi Pillay, the UN high commissioner for human rights, said Wednesday that of the more than 600 Palestinian deaths in the Gaza Strip reviewed by the UN, three-quarters were civilians. Two of the Israelis who died were civilians.



Abu Sitta came to Canada in 1993 as a refugee. He runs a wellness clinic with his wife in Mississauga. His two sisters, brother and other relatives live in Gaza.

"The situation, as you know, is very bad. They don't have electricity, running water. They are running a shortage of food, medicine and supplies. It's really a war situation," Abu Sitta said.

"They want to go on with their daily life and they can't.

"My wife, she has her mother - my mother-in-law she was warned twice to leave the house because the Israelis were going to bomb it for no apparent reason," he said. "She's 75 years old. She left the house and slept in the street for the whole night."

It turned out that a nearby house in the area, Khan

Younis, was the likely target in the end, and his mother-inlaw's was spared. "They had some damage, but nothing major," he said.

Abu Sitta said he's also related to the al-Batash family, 17 of whom were killed in a bombing in July. "Every three

minutes, there's a new thing happening and I say, hopefully, it's not my family," he said.

"I hope it's not someone I know. But every life is a loss of life - Israeli life or Palestinian life. It cannot go on like this.

English has a daughter, son-in-law and grandchildren in Israel, in Beit Shemesh. They keep in touch by phone, email, WhatsApp and Skype.

He said he worries about their safety - something that's made worse because, as a senior vice-president of the Centre for Israel and Jewish Affairs, he's in touch with information on the conflict "on a minute-by-minute basis.'

"The information is anxiety-producing," he said. He has an app on his

iPhone that alerts him to any sirens going off in Israel at

any time.

"Although I like to know what's happening, I'm somewhat fearful when I see the alarm go off — and it goes off frequently," he said.

In the area where his family lives there have been five air-raid sirens, he said.

"The number is not as significant as the unpredictability of the sirens. Hamas, in its desire to destroy Israel, doesn't send a schedule that indicates at what time they're going to be sending missiles. They can go off in the middle of the night. They can go off when people are shopping. That breeds anxiety," he said, adding that he worries what the long-term effect of that anxiety will be on his grandchildren.

Both men want peace.

"The people of Israel, the government of Israel, really yearns for peace and would like nothing more than to live in peace without the constant threat of missiles which are designed only to maim, kill them and further the Hamas aim of destroying Israel," said English. "Peace is in our hearts and a truly normal life for all of the residents of the Middle East is in our hearts."

"I hope to see an end to this violence and I hope for a Palestinian state, side-by-side with an Israeli state," said Abu Sitta.

"This is our ultimate goal. This is what will bring peace to the Middle East.'

Six people were indicted Wednesday in an international ring that took over more than 1,600 StubHub users' accounts and fraudulently bought tickets to such prime events as Jay-Z and Elton John concerts and Broadway shows like The Book of Mormon, said the Manhattan district attorney, Cyrus R. Vance Jr.

Three others have been arrested in London and one in Toronto, Vance said.

"Today's arrests and indictment connect a global network of hackers, identity thieves and money-launderers who victimized countless individuals," Vance told a news conference.

He said the thieves would resell the tickets bought fraudulently and split up the proceeds. Money stolen in the

City to monitor Ford Fest for campaigning

Inundated. City hit with complaints that Ford Fest is a political event in a park, but city manager says rules are being followed

Toronto city staff will be at Ford Fest ready to stop Mayor Rob Ford, Councillor Doug Ford and anybody on their re-election team from campaigning in a city park.

Inundated with public complaints over the issuance of a permit for the annual barbecue despite a ban on politicking in city-owned spaces, city manager Joe Pennachetti is sending parks staff and bylaw enforcement officers to monitor Thomson Memorial Park in Scarborough on Friday.

"What they try to do is make sure campaigning isn't happening — if there are campaign signs or literature, remove them," and prevent

City ombudsman Fiona Crean received 100 complaints and at least another 100 went directly to city hall since the permit for Ford Fest was issued on Tuesday.



other breaches of the city's policy on use of public resources during an election campaign, said city spokeswoman Jackie DeSouza.

Staff have not been dispatched for other such events, she added. The ban defines campaigning as "any activity ... meant to elicit support during the election period," while campaign materials include "literature, banners, posters, pictures, buttons, clothing or other paraphernalia

However, with a permit for the non-political "special event" issued, the monitors will have no power to prevent Ford Fest guests from overtly campaigning for "Ford More Years" at the heavily promoted barbecue.

Representatives for the Fords promised senior city staff the politicians and their team would follow the rules, DeSouza added. **TORSTAR NEWS SERVICE**

Gym pass lets you sample choices

Buffet style. Fitness buffs can join a class at 20 of Tryfit's partner gyms across Toronto

Toronto's phobic fitness enthusiasts can now sample some of the city's best gyms and attempt new workouts thanks to the Tryfit pass.

"The angle of the pass is really to introduce people to their next favourite workout and their next favourite studio," said Jeff Stief, a 25-year-old Schulich School of Business student and Tryfit co-creator.

The \$49 Tryfit pass allows fitness buffs to join a class at 20 of its partner gyms across the city. Women pass-holders actually get a bonus 21st class at the female-only Flirty Girl Fitness, one of the partner gyms.

Stief dreamed up the business venture when he noticed

that most fitness passes stick to one type of training and he yearned to diversify his workout.

The pass includes a broad range of activities from a mix of established and newcomer studios. Over the course of six months, athletes can dabble in obstacle course training, attempt hot yoga and learn some self-defence.

While Stief admits it took some convincing to bring gyms on board, the owners generally seem excited at the chance to bring in new busi-



ness.

It can be hard to recruit newcomers to Bang Fitness, explains its director Geoff Girvitz. The studio's specialized programs for individuals

and small-group training can be hard to sell, until people actually try it. Tryfit "could be a great

chatting with newcomers about their fitness goals. He hopes it will bring serious starting point for a much potential clients into his gym longer term training prowho are doing "a little bit

cess," said Girvitz, who loves

of amateur detective work" looking for the right studio for their training needs.

Bang Fitness once offered a Groupon, but he said the promotion mostly brought in people in a "perpetual dis-count mode" who were not invested in finding a new gym, but were always hunting for the best bargain.

Tryfit is more of a winwin for businesses and consumers, he said, offering a discounted sample of fitness options so people can make an informed choice on which gym to sign a contract with.

"It's not something you can ride out indefinitely," said Girvitz.

Tryfit officially launched this week and will sell up to 1,000 passes during its first six-month trial. After six months, Stief wants to offer his current studio partners another stint on the next round of passes, but eventually aims to rejig the lineup twice a year.

"We want to offer that opportunity to keep on exploring their options here in the city," he said.

Deadly plane crash 'a very sad day in the history of Taiwanese aviation'

Flight GE222. At least 47 people killed when airplane carrying 58 people crashed during second landing attempt

A plane trying to land in stormy weather crashed in Taiwan Wednesday, killing at least 47.

The ATR-72, operated by Taiwan's TransAsia Airways, was carrying 58 passengers and crew when it crashed on the island of Penghu, authorities said. The plane was arriving from the city of Kaohsiung in southern Taiwan.

Two people aboard the plane were French citizens and the rest Taiwanese, Transport Minister Yeh Kuang-shih said.

The crash was Taiwan's first fatal air accident in 12 years and came after Typhoon Matmo passed, causing heavy rains that continued into Wed-

Flight GE222 left Kaohsiung at 4:53 p.m. for Magong, according to Taiwan's Civil Aeronautics Administration.

 It lost contact with the tower at 7:06 p.m. after saying it would make a second landing attempt.

nesday. Some 200 flights had been cancelled earlier that day.

The death toll was 47 on Wednesday, according to Wen Chia-hung, with the Penghu disaster response centre. Eleven others were injured and authorities were seeking one person who might have been in a house struck by wreckage.

President Ma Ying-jeou called it "a very sad day in the history of Taiwanese aviation," according to his office, the state Central News Agency reported. **THE ASSOCIATED PRESS**

from the inspection of the GSK-owned plant on its website Tuesday evening after the end of the business day.

The production facility at Ste. Foy, Que., was issued a warning letter last month by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, which raised concerns about bacterial contamination problems in the plant.

The FDA noted GSK — formerly known as GlaxoSmith-Kline — has repeatedly had to discard batches of vaccine made at the facility because of bacterial counts that registered above specified limits. In a letter dated June 12 it said 21 per cent of this year's product could not be released to the market.

The Ste. Foy plant has contracts to produce 53 per cent of Canada's seasonal flu vaccine for the coming flu season as well as 23 million doses for the U.S. market.

The regulatory agency said the facility was given a "compliant" rating because none of the deviations identified "would affect the safety or quality of the product to be supplied, nor pose a risk to the health and safety of Canadians."

Militants release captives after pressure from poor town

Suspected Abu Sayyaf militants have freed three abducted aid workers in the southern Philippines after the government withheld anti-poverty funds, prompting an impoverished town to pressure the rebels to release the captives, officials said Wednesday.

Social Welfare Secretary Corazon Soliman said the three aid workers and a companion were kidnapped Thursday in remote Talipao town in Sulu province where they were checking on families who received aid and working on another anti-poverty project. Due to the kidnappings, the government withheld the cash grants to thousands of poor families to ensure the safety of aid workers. Talipao officials then exerted pressure on the militants, who separately freed their hostages this week without ransom payment, Soliman said. THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

B.C. man faces terror charge, accused of joining Islamist fighters

A British Columbia man has been charged under a new anti-terrorism law for allegedly leaving the country to join Islamist fighters in Syria.

It's the first time the recent Criminal Code legislation has been used as a tool to fight terrorism, said Cpl. David Falls.

Police say 25-year-old Hasibullah Yusufzai is accused of committing an offence for the benefit of a terrorist group or was directed by or associated with such a group.

"The individual is known to have travelled to Syria to join Islamist fighters," the RCMP said in a statement. "This case underscores

the reality that there are individuals in Canada who have embraced the extremist ideology and who are willing to act upon it."

The Israeli-Palestinian war over public opinion

'Battle in the modern age.' Technology, social media exponentially increased propaganda from both sides

Beyond the boom of Israeli airstrikes and the stream of rockets fired from Gaza, Israel and Hamas are also battling to control the message emanating from this latest Israeli-Palestinian conflagration.

Using videos, Twitter, text messages, leaflets and phone calls, both sides have attempted to direct the tone of the fighting — for their own public, their opponent's population and for a global audience. Propaganda is nothing new in battle, but technology and social media have exponentially increased the ability of each side to penetrate their intended audiences.

Israel has tried to make its case that it is defending its citizens from unprovoked attacks

but taking steps to avoid killing civilians on the other side. Hamas has appealed to the world by pointing to the high civilian death toll from Israel's onslaught on Gaza. Israel and Hamas are each addressing the other's populations as well. Israel has pushed the message to Palestinians in Gaza that the territory's Hamas rulers are to blame for the bloodshed. In phone calls that the military makes to Gazans to tell them to evacuate their homes before a strike, the recorded script in Arabic also tells them that Hamas is using them as human shields.

Hamas, in turn, has sent text messages directly to Israelis, warning them that the group will continue firing rockets at them until its demands like the end of the long-stifling blockade of the tiny Gaza Strip — are met.

"This is a war over public opinion," said Yuval Dror, an expert in digital communications. "It's an inseparable part of battle in the modern age."

Israel says it launched the war on July 8 in response to heavy rocket fire out of Hamascontrolled Gaza. By midday Wednesday, at least 657 Palestinians and 31 Israelis were reported to have been killed in the fighting, which escalated last week with the start of a ground offensive. **THE ASSOCIATED PRESS**

Gaza Strip. U.S. secretary of state says 'still work to be done' in ceasefire talks

Israeli troops battled Hamas militants on Wednesday near a southern Gaza Strip town as the top U.S. diplomat reported progress in efforts to end fighting that has so far killed more than 680 Palestinians and 34 Israelis.

But neither side appeared to be backing down, after Palestinian rocket fire led several international airlines to cancel flights to Tel Aviv and Israeli troops clashed with Hamas near the Gaza town of Khan Younis in heavy fighting that forced dozens of families to flee.

U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry flew into Tel Aviv despite a Federal Aviation Administration ban following a Hamas rocket that hit near the airport the day before, reflecting his determination to achieve a ceasefire.

He met with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu after earlier talks with Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas and U.N. chief Ban Ki-moon, who is also in the region. But



U.S. officials have downplayed expectations for an immediate, lasting truce.

In Jerusalem, Kerry said negotiations toward a Gaza ceasefire were making some progress as he met for a second time this week with Ban. "We certainly have made steps forward," Kerry said. "There's still work to be done." THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

Bodies of Malaysia Airlines victims land in Netherlands

Flight 17. Dutch officials say they've taken over investigation of disaster

Two military transport planes carrying 40 coffins, bearing victims of Malaysia Airlines Flight 17, landed Wednesday in Eindhoven, Netherlands.

Six days after the Boeing 777 was shot down over eastern Ukraine, the first bodies finally arrived in the country that bore the heaviest toll in a crash that killed 298 people. A Dutch Hercules C-130 that Dutch government spokesman Lodewijk Hekking said was carrying 16 coffins touched down first, closely followed by an Australian C-17 Globemaster plane carrying 24 coffins.

Dutch officials said they have taken charge of the stalled investigation of the airline disaster and pleaded for unhindered access to the wreckage.

British investigators began work on a pair of "black boxes" to retrieve information on the flight's last minutes. The Dutch Safety Board said specialists found the AUGMENTED REALITY

Bubonic plague death sparks quarantine in Chinese city

Parts of a northern Chinese city have been quarantined after state media said a man there died of bubonic plague.

China's official Xinhua News Agency said Tuesday that 151 people were under observation in the city of Yumen in Gansu province after authorities determined they had come in contact with a man who died of the plague July 16. Investigators believe the

man contracted the bacterial infection after contact with a marmot, Xinhua said.

The report said all the people under quarantine were in good health, but that 10 checkpoints were still blocking off parts of the city of about 180,000.

Bubonic plague killed millions of people in Europe in the 14th century and tens of thousands in China in the 19th century. It remains endemic in northwest China and is spread largely through flea bites. The bacteria can cause gangrene, seizures and fever. **THE ASSOCIATED PRESS**

AIDS group suing landlord for 'discrimination'



HIV phobia? Landlord allegedly terminates contract on day not-for-profit picks up keys



An Ottawa AIDS organization is suing a landlord and real estate agency over allegations of discrimination and "HIV phobia" after the building owner ended its lease.

The AIDS Committee of Ottawa signed a lease for the fourth floor of 240 Bank St. in May 2013 and was due to move in the following October. But on the day the notfor-profit organization went to pick up keys for the building, the landlord allegedly terminated the contract.

The ACO had planned to provide safe injection and safe inhalation supplies and install a shower, laundry facility and kitchen. But the landlord claimed those plans violated the lease.

According to court documents the ACO is seeking \$35,000 in damages for discrimination on the basis of disability. The plaintiff's statement of claim calls the lease termination move "high-handed, malicious, arbitrary and highly repre-

hensible."

It also alleges the landlord expressed concerns the ACO's participants would spread lice to other visitors in the building, pose security risks in the stairwells and "have to share the hallways" with other visitors. The allegations in the claim have not been proven in court.

"We felt that ... it was discriminatory and there was some HIV phobia involved in the stance that the landlords took," said Khaled Salam, executive director of ACO.

The landlord — named as 240 Bank Street Holdings Limited — denies the accusations. The ACO never dealt dir-

ectly with the landlord prior to signing the lease. Real estate agency Cushman & Wakefield Ottawa acted as the dual agent, according to the landlord's defence claim.

The landlord also claims it was "misinformed" by Cushman & Wakefield and never knew of the ACO's plans to build a laundry room, kitchen and provide safe injection supplies.

The lease states the space is to be used only as a community centre and office and that cooking is prohibited. However, a separate section says the tenant could build separate offices, a shower, laundry room and kitchen with the landlord's approval.

Companies fined for calling people on do-not-call list

Four Toronto-area companies have paid \$84,000 in penalties for allegedly violating telemarketing rules by calling people registered on the National Do Not Call List, Canada's telecom regulator said Wednesday. The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunica-

tions Commission (CRTC) said the companies — Ecosmart Home Services Inc., Loyal Seal Windows and Doors, Home Comfort Group and Pegasus Peaks — called people directly or via a third-party firm.

The CRTC has also issued a notice of violation to a fifth company — Action Windows and Doors — with a penalty of \$24,000.

To date the CRTC has levied \$4 million in penalties.

China detains five staffers of suspect meat seller

Five employees of a company accused of selling expired beef and chicken to McDonald's, KFC and other restaurants in China were detained by police Wednesday after an official said illegal activity was an organized effort by the supplier. China's food safety agency said on its website that its investigators found unspecified illegal activity by Husi Food Co. but gave no confirmation about whether any expired meat had been found.

The State Food and Drug Administration's statement Wednesday said investigators seized 160 tons of raw material and 1,100 tons of finished products from Husi. **THE ASSOCIATED PRESS**

Anti-poverty charity bilked of \$9M, ex-CEO off to prison

Met Council. Former executive gets up to 10 years for conspiring to overcharge for insurance

The politically connected former CEO of a prominent New York City charity was sentenced to prison Wednesday for helping to steal more than \$9 million US from the anti-poverty organization.

William Rapfogel, who once headed the Metropolitan Council on Jewish Poverty, will serve a term of 40 months to 10 years. He pleaded guilty in April

to grand larceny, money laundering and other charges, and to date has paid \$3 million in restitution. Rapfogel became the executive director of the Met Council in 1992. He soon joined conspirators in conniving to overcharge the charity for insurance, then pocketing the difference for themselves, state prosecutors said.

"Over a 20-year period of time, he conspired with others to steal over \$9 million, and personally stole over \$1 million, from the people who needed it most, to benefit himself and his lifestyle," said Assistant Attorney General Gary Fishman.

He used \$27,000 of that money to pay a contractor working on his home, and he had more than \$400,000 in cash hidden in his home when investigators searched it in 2013, authorities said.

The search engine for flight, hotel and car rental deals crunched the numbers behind how Canadians searched for travel since it launched here last May and found there were fairly consistent trends in pricing. On average, domestic flights in Canada were cheapest if departing on a Tuesday and returning on a Friday. Flights leaving on a Thursday and returning on a Sunday tended to be most expensive.

International flights taking off from Canada were typically best priced on Thursdays with a return flight on a Monday. Departing on a Monday and returning on a Friday resulted in the most expen-

sive tickets.

"These trends we're seeing in Canada are not that different from the trends we're seeing in other countries," said Debby Soo, a vice-president with Kayak, which handles 100 million searches a month. "Often times you hear that flights departing on Tuesdays are the cheapest and I've seen that trend in the U.S. and in some markets in Europe." THE CANADIAN PRESS

Costa Concordia on its way to become scrap metal

The Costa Concordia cruise liner began its final voyage Wednesday, slowly being towed away from the tiny Italian island where it capsized more than two years ago, killing 32 people.

Boat sirens wailed and bells tolled on the island just before two tugboats pulled the Concordia away from Giglio's port, where the luxury liner ended up on its side in pristine Mediterranean waters, after being gashed by a reef it struck when its captain steered too close to the island. The tugs are bringing the crippled ship on a four-day journey to the northwestern port of Genoa, which is home to the ship's owner, Costa Crociere Spa. The vessel will be scrapped there.

Accompanying the tugs and Concordia are several boats to monitor any pollution in the waters, which are home to dolphins. Nets have been attached to sides of the liner in case any remnants of the Concordia's last passenger cruise — dishware, pots and pans, bed linen, chairs and other furnishings — tumble out of the ship during towing. A daring engineering operation set the Concordia upright last September. Then, over the past few months, custom-built tanks, now filled with air to serve as kind of water wings to facilitate floating, were attached to the liner's flanks. The salvage master of the entire operation, Nick Sloane, said he felt a bit nervous before boarding a special command centre attached to the top of the Concordia to monitor the final voyage. An Italian naval admiral was also aboard.

Flying from the Concordia was the Italian flag, since regulations require the banner to be visible on the Italianregistered ship until scrapping. THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

Hip-hop elements grab spotlight at Unity Festival

Charity. A four-day celebration raises awareness about worthy cause



Like so many of Toronto's summer festivals, Unity is a celebration of a culture — in this case, hip hop.

Four days of activities culminate in a free outdoor concert at Yonge Dundas Square headlined by hip-hop legends Biz Markie and Maestro.

But the show is a Mc-Guffin — a hook for the curious to raise awareness for Unity Charity.

"It's the fireworks that let's people know we exist," confirms founder and breakdancer Mikey Prosserman, who is also the charity's executive-director.

Unity runs year-round after-school programs centred on hip-hop culture in a dozen schools across Ontario.

He stresses that Unity is not a hip-hop school where kids learn how to be the best MC or breakdancer. The programs use elements of hip-



hop culture — rapping, dancing, graffiti art — as a way

"The art form is used as a tool of engagement to de-

velop a better individual." But it's not just the abil-

ity to breakdance or beat box that empowers people — it's the community that surrounds hip hop says Prosserman. "I'm a breakdancer, and that really saved me," he says. As a teenager, Prosserman watched his parents split up and his mother suffer from schizophrenia. "I could get rid of the anger by dancing it out. It's not going to remove the problem, but allows you Other Unity highlights

Although Saturday's concert is Unity Festival's "fireworks," there are other programs showcasing the skills students learn throughout the year. Unity breakdance, tonight at Tattoo, is a competition for dancers 18 and under, while Unity MC & Spoken Word, tomorrow at 918 Bathurst, highlights students' writing and rhyming skills, with a graffiti art showcase to boot. Best of all, each event is headlined by an out-of-town artist brought in to help mentor students. "If you spend the year watching videos on YouTube and then this guy shows up at your door, it's pretty powerful," says Prosserman.

to approach life with a clear mind. You can focus."

Hip hop's emphasis on mentorship — sharing what you know with those who don't — sets it apart from other music cultures.

Prosserman fondly recalls hanging out at community centres with friends, exchanging skills and ideas, constantly searching for ways to impress one another.

"Nothing compares to that family you develop," he says. "That's something you can't get in rock 'n' roll."

Imelda May is one of the biggest stars in Ireland right now and it's thanks to the likes of Johnny Burnette and Wanda Jackson, original American rockabilly rebels who inspired the Dubliner's career. However, as May's upcoming fall release Tribal proves, her musical wanderlust includes more then rockabilly, and encompasses blues and jazz, too.

"I love the rockabilly world. It's the original punk rock," says May.

Sneak peek. The premiere party for geek culture kicks off today in California

Now a decades-old tradition, Comic-Con San Diego is the world's premiere celebration of geek culture. This year it takes place from July 24 to 27.

Created in 1970 and originally dedicated to comic books, Comic-Con has expanded its purview to include movies, TV shows, mangas and video games.

Find Eid inspiration in comforting dish

Moghrabieh & Fish Cakes with Preserved Lemons and Harissa. The Muslim holy month of Ramadan ends next week and while the religion is practised all over the world, its origins, like this dish, lie in the desert lands of the Middle East

"Moghrabieh comes from the word 'Maghreb," write Nadia Zerouali and Merijn Tol in their book Under the Shade of Olive Trees. "This Middle Eastern answer to couscous is basically a ball-shaped pasta, and here we've made a type of risotto with it. The moghrabieh is cooked in a delicious sauce that we seasoned with cinnamon and allspice, typical Middle Eastern seasonings."

1. Bring a large pot of water to boil. Using a sharp knife, slice a shallow X into the bottom of each of the tomatoes and submerge them in the boiling

Ingredients

• 5 small vine-ripened tomatoes • 2 small sweet onions • Mild olive oil • 1 tbsp cinnamon • 1/2 tbsp allspice • 1 3/4 cups (350 g) moghrabieh (Lebanese couscous) or Turkish barley pasta • 1/2 preserved lemon (find them at Middle Eastern grocery stores) • 14 oz (400 g) halibut, striped bass, or other firm white fish • 1 bunch flat-leaf parsley, chopped • 1 clove garlic, chopped

• 2 tbsp harissa (a spice sold in tubes or cans at Middle Eastern grocery stores)

water for about 1 minute. Peel the skin off the tomatoes and dice them.

2. Mince the onions. In a large frying pan, heat a generous amount of olive oil over medium heat and sauté the onions with the cinnamon and allspice for about 10 minutes, stirring frequently and lowering the heat to keep them from

burning.

3. Add the tomatoes and mix in the moghrabieh as well. Add 4 1/2 cups (1 l) water and about 1/2 teaspoon salt. Cook the pasta over low heat for about 30 minutes, stirring frequently toward the end, until it is thick and creamy like risotto. (Add some water if the pasta is cooking dry.) Season with salt if needed.

4. Remove the pulp from the preserved lemon and slice the peel into thin strips. In a food processor, purée the fish with the preserved lemon, parsley, garlic, and harissa. Season with a pinch of salt. Shape the fish mixture into small, flat cakes (this is best done with wet hands).

5. Heat some oil in a skillet (nonstick works best for these delicate patties) and fry the fish cakes until golden brown on both sides and cooked through, about 3 minutes per side. Serve over the moghrabieh.

Legal Matters

Leaky roof causes condo-sternation

In April we sold our condo townhouse. The buyers, before agreeing to purchase, had a few concerns because of what was stated in the status certificate. A basement foundation leak (fixed last year), a leaky roof (which was fixed after the purchase

- May 2014), and finally the rather low reserve fund. The buyers even spoke to the condo treasurer about these concerns. They asked us for a price decrease which we complied with. Over the past couple of weeks, the condo board has mentioned that the rest of the roofs (20 units) also need to be completely redone. Due to the depleting reserve fund, they have

voted in favour of imposing a special assessment. The facts are: 1) No one had any knowledge of a special assessment would be required. 2) The buyer knew about the depleted reserve funds. 3) We (the seller) already took a price cut. The condo board seems adamant to get the special assessment in place before Aug. 1, as that is our closing day. As there

was no knowledge that a special assessment would be required when we sold, my question is, with two weeks left before our closing day, who is responsible to pay the special assessment?



The answer to this problem is not that straightforward. Typically a special assessment is paid by the owner during their ownership of a condo. However, the Board of the condominium usually sets a special assessment to be paid over the span of a few months rather than in one payment. So you can envision that there may be payments applicable to your ownership and to the buyer's ownership. However, because you have knowledge of this assessment, the payment should be coming from you and a holdback may be required to pay the fees as they come due.

Transit and residential initiatives revive neighbourhood strip



St. Clair West is the new go-to destination for foodies. The nascent restaurant alley has seemingly sprung up along the LRT rails. All manner of tastes can be had from hipster cafés to formal haute cuisine, from traditional to trendy to neighbourhood sports bars.

The inauguration of the St. Clair West LRT was followed by a spate of new condo developments along the route. And with those new developments come new customers for local business. Restaurateurs speak of their high degree of optimism for the future. Many have already experienced a business transformation as a result of the new transit and residential initiatives.

Michael Pronesti is the sommelier and food and beverage manager at the Ferro Bar Café. The family-owned



and operated business has been a St. Clair fixture for the past 23 years. It was previously a notorious neighbourhood pool hall.

"I definitely think it's great for the neighbourhood," says Pronesti. "I think that St. Clair is becoming more of a destination. We're seeing some really good restaurants opening up. Younger people want to come to this area and see what the restaurants are doing, what they're about."

St. Clair restos like Ferro are constantly reinventing themselves, explains Pronesti, in order to stay on top of the new trends and fads happening across the city. "We just put wine on tap. With the young people coming to this area, you really need to adapt to what they are experiencing. The wine on tap is really cool, it's really caught on fire here. We're the first to do it on the strip."

As little as 10 years ago, the area was nothing special, says Murray Goldman, whose company The Goldman Group has been instrumental in revitalizing the area. 'When I first looked at Bathurst and St. Clair, it was in a downward spiral," Goldman tells Metro. "It was a neighbourhood that was static, an old neighbourhood with nothing happening to refresh it or keep it vital."

Tenants face the challenge of how to make someone else's house their home within a limited budget and restrictions from landlords, but there are many ways they can introduce a personal touch to a rented space.

Renting as lifestyle choice Rental properties seem like temporary housing, but according to interior designer Jenny Martin, a lot of people make renting their lifestyle choice and do it long term.

Invest in strategic pieces "When a tenant moves into a place it can be hard to really make it their own without investing a bunch of money into something you'll be leaving behind," she says.

According to the Victoriabased Martin, renters should consider investing in stra-

Don't hesitate to ask

Switch up lighting fixtures "People can purchase a feature dining room pendant to be installed by an electrician. The existing one is boxed up and the two are switched out when they leave," she says. "You may not want to do things like that if you were renting for a year. It would be better for a more long-term situation."

Make temporary modifications

Building managers and landlords may have strict rules around what changes can be made to a rental space, but Martin says there are ways tenants can add big impact to a space without making permanent modifications.

Can't paint? Pops of colour are still possible

If there are limitations on painting, the easiest way is to add a pop of colour through furniture, art and draperies.

Lean on

architectural elements "Spending more time on how your furniture relates to the space is important because you can integrate colours with pieces of furniture or toss pillows," Martin says. "A tenant could get a custom or antique mantel to lean against the wall to add some architectural elements without having to be installed."

Add value to the property Even though landlords can have concerns about their renters making changes to their property, interior decorator Chantelle Butterfield says many are looking to add value to their home.

"Tenants just don't ask their landlords what they are open to," says Butterfield, owner of Funktional Spaces in Saskatoon.

Update kitchen cabinets

Butterfield says an easy way a tenant can both make a dramatic change to their rental space and add value to their landlord's property is by updating the kitchen with painted and refinished cabinet doors plus hardware.

"It's all a matter of budget, and what you have permission to do," says Butterfield. "Painting and refinishing the cabinets can add value to the home, but a tenant could remove the doors and replace them, and store away the old ones and take the new ones when they left."

Use your imagination

While it may seem tenants face restrictions, Butterfield says they are only limited by imagination and budget. THE CANADIAN PRESS

It's the end of the roll as we know it. High tech holder rules the bathroom



Conceived by its designers as a restroom accessory to help you go in peace, the Roll-Scout automatically keeps track of toilet paper levels and can alert you in advance if the roll is reaching its end. At first glance, RollScout looks like any other welldesigned toilet paper holder, but it's one with a couple of clever high-tech tricks beneath its minimalist exterior.

Infrared sensors

Chief among them is a set of infrared sensors that measure the thickness of the roll currently in service. Once a roll passes a certain threshold, the RollScout's coloured warning system kicks in. A pulsing amber light will start to shine to attract attention and as the roll gets smaller still, the amber will give way to red.

Smartphone alerts

But that's just the start. If RollScout passes its initial \$37,500 funding target — its

Kickstarter campaign went live this week — the flashing lights will be augmented by smartphone alerts telling you that the upstairs bathroom is running low on paper and that you should do something about it.

Simple to install

The RollScout is powered by a single A23 battery — so no need to call out an electrician – and installation requires a drill and a screwdriver for fixing it to the wall, just like a regular toilet roll holder.

The production version will be available in a choice of finishes - polished gold, antique bronze, brushed nickel, ceramic white and 14K gold.

Although the RollScout is generating a lot of media attention, the buzz is so far not translating into financial support. At the time of writing, the gadget had attracted just 18 backers and a combined \$664 despite early bird offers of a brushed nickel RollScout for just \$59. AFP

Communities being built



President and CEO of the Building Industry and Land Development Association (BILD) n be found at twitter.com/ ldgta, facebook.com/bildgta, d bildblogs.ca. The building and develop-

ment industry builds more than just homes. It creates complete communities so GTA residents can work, play and shop close to where they live.

A good example is World on Yonge in Markham, built by BILD member Liberty Developments, featuring office towers, condominiums, a hotel and retail space which includes a 40,000-square-ft. grocery store.

"It's office, retail and residential at one site," explains Liberty's senior vice-president and general counsel Marco Filice. "Your friends come from out of town, they can stay at the hotel. You need to shop, you can go to the mall. You want to work at the office building, you work

at the office building. World on Yonge is a true mixed-use community in compliance with Places to Grow, 20 years ahead of schedule."

There are also two acres of new public parkland on site. In fact, more than 40 per cent of the site is parkland or green roof technology -– a system that collects all the rainwater from the site into a 60,000-gallon cistern, which then reuses it for grass, plants and public toilets.

Another environmentally conscious feature is the amount of underground parking. World on Yonge limits one parking spot per unit to encourage walking or cycling. This is where it helps to have a mall so close to your home.

If you do need to commute, public transit and major highways are just minutes away — yet another example of a project's conformity to Places to Grow.

"It's a unique project, and it was enjoyable to build," Marco said. "I hope it can be used as a

demonstrable tool about how to build sustainable development for others.

It was a game of two halves, with Argentine midfielder Erik Lamela scoring twice for Tottenham in the first and Toronto answering back in a far more competitive and entertaining second after the teams combined for 17 changes at the break.

Defoe wore the captain's armband but got virtually no service from his teammates and found himself having to take up the role of playmaker to get something going. The England striker was substituted at halftime, one of seven changes by manager Ryan Nelsen. Veteran Dwayne De Rosario took over as captain.

On a night where he was on the marquee, Defoe was largely on the outside looking in. Tottenham controlled

Stamkos on returning to Toronto: 'We'll see'

LeBron's path. Tampa Bay forward focused on 2014, not 2016

LeBron James going home to play for the Cleveland Cavaliers led to speculation about whether a står NHL player might do the same in the near future.

Naturally, Steven Stamkos was at the centre of that speculation. The Tampa Bay Lightning captain and Markham native could be an unrestricted free agent in the summer of 2016, and the allure of playing for the Toronto Maple Leafs could be there.

"We'll see what happens. It's a couple years away," Stam-kos said Wednesday. "Right now I'm focused on what I have to do to win in Tampa, and I think we've really established ourselves as a team that can compete in upcoming years.

"For me, that's the important thing, is getting a chance to win. It looks like we're going to have that chance for a couple years.'

At the age of 24, Stamkos is one of the most marketable stars in the NHL. He has topped 50 goals in a season twice al-

ready and only missed out on representing Canada at the Sochi Olympics because of a broken leg.

Stamkos made a run with the Lightning to the Eastern Conference final in 2011, and Tampa Bay was swept by the Montreal Canadiens in this year's playoffs. The Stanley Cup is his priority now, something he can legitimately think about with general manager Steve Yzerman piecing together one of the best young teams in the league.

"We have a good thing going down in Tampa," Stamkos said at a Coca-Cola ball-hockey promotional event. "We have a great owner, we got a great GM in Steve Yzerman and we got a good young team." THE CANADIAN PRESS
